Beware of practicing your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven. So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your alms may be done in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you. And whenever you pray, do not be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, so that they may be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you. When you are praying, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do; for they think that they will be heard because of their many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him. Pray then in this way: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And do not lead us into temptation, for we are not strong; but deliver us from the evil one. For if you forgive the trespasses of others, your Father will also forgive your trespasses. But if you do not forgive the trespasses of others, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses. And whenever you have received your Father's forgiveness, you must also forgive others. For if you do not forgive others, your Father will not forgive your trespasses. Store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. The eye is the lamp of the body. If then the eye is single, the whole body will be full of light. But if the eye is bad, the whole body will be in darkness. As little as the speck in the eye is, so little is the log that protrudes. If then the log is pulled out of the eye, and the speck is removed, then you will see. But if you do not remove the log, and the speck is still there, you will see only a speck in your neighbour's eye, but do not notice the log in your own eye? Or how can you say to your neighbour, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when there is a log protruding from your own eye? You hypocrite, first remove the log from your own eye, and then you will clearly see to remove the speck from your neighbour's eye.
